COOS BAY PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEE MEETING MINUTES May 16, 2018

Call to Order – C. Benward called the meeting to order at 5:17 p. m.

Board Members present: Curt Benward, Teri Harris Jones, Gina Sutherland, Steve Metz, James Moore, Bob More and Jennifer Groth.

Others in Attendance: Marie Benton, Ellen Thompson and Sami Pierson. We met new full-time library employee Brittany Buxton, who dropped in briefly to introduce herself.

Public Comment – Sami received two emails from patrons who had concerns and questions about moving the library. Sami sent replies explaining the reasons for the move and the selection of the new library site.

Minutes and Circulation – We reviewed minutes of the April 18th board meeting and April circulation figures. S. Metz made a motion to approve the minutes and J. Moore seconded. Approved unanimously. Circulation was down a bit, but gate count was unchanged. Sami reported that 3,691 items were checked out electronically District-wide in March.

Treasurer's Report – We reviewed library revenue and expenditures for the first 83% of the fiscal year and the memorial funds account summary. We have expended 70% of the materials and services budget and 74% of the personnel services budget. B. More requested additional information about disbursements, suggesting the addition of a short tag such as "books" or "program refreshments" to each line item. Sami agreed to include this information in future.

Correspondence – None

Librarian's Report – Sami told us that we will be getting new wi-fi equipment in July. This will improve our internet service and funding for this is provided in part by a federal program to provide better connectivity in rural and high-poverty regions of the country. A marine life story time was held at the Marine Life Center in Charleston. Today's job fair was well attended and library meeting rooms continue to be very well used.

Friends of the Library Report – M. Benton reported that the May book sale brought in \$852 plus a \$50 dollar donation and April book store sales were \$695.01. The next book sale will be June 2nd and 3rd and the Friends will hold a plant sale from 9:00 a. m. to 2:00 p. m. on Saturday, May 19th. Anyone with plants or garden-related items to donate for the sale may drop them off at the library on the morning of Friday, May 18th. Bi-Mart and Safeway both donated gift cards for the sale. Books and materials will be half-price tomorrow in the Friends Book Store from noon to 5:30 p. m.

Library Foundation Report– B. More reported that the Foundation Facebook page is now up and will soon have a donation button added. The Foundation meets tomorrow and planning for the October 20th fall fundraiser will be on the agenda.

Old Business -

Security Guard – Sami told us that she is moving forward with hiring a security guard for the library. An RFP went out yesterday and responses are due back in two and a half weeks. We should have a full-time security guard in the library by late June.

New Business -

Bulletin Board and Literature Rack Policies – We reviewed the proposed changes to the language of these policies. B. More made a motion to approve the proposed revisions to these policies and S. Metz seconded. Unanimously approved.

Appointment to the County Library Board – The Coos Bay Library has two positions on the County Library Board. Doug Wuerth has volunteered to serve a second term as one of our representatives on this Board. B. More made a motion to approve Doug Wuerth for this position and S. Metz seconded. Approved unanimously.

Dolly Parton Imagination Library – Sami told us about the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, a program that sends one book a month to children from the ages 0 to 5. Parents enroll their children in the program and each library serves children within their own service area (the confines of the Coos Bay School District in our case). Two donors volunteered to fund the program for our library for the first three years and so Sami signed us up. After three years, Sami hopes to have other funding available to sustain the program into the future, but, if such funding does not materialize, we will stop enrolling new children and phase the program out as enrolled children age out of eligibility. Sami's estimates for the costs of the program are: \$1,886 for year one, \$4,538 for year two, \$7,562 for year three, \$10,582 in year four and \$13,610 in year five and the years thereafter. The Myrtle Point Library joined the program a few months ago and it is the hope that all Coos County libraries will be participants.

Announcements – Sami included a board roster in the board packet and asked us to check this for accuracy. Both the Reedsport and North Douglas library district ballot measures are passing as of the latest vote counts. Sami has applied for a grant to fund 16 local adventure backpacks that would be available for checkout. Each backpack would contain information and resources about one of eight different subjects of local interest such as whales or trees.
